We need a brave adventurer to go visit eight different islands and talk to Ngā Rangatira the Island Chiefs to see how you can restore financial capability. Are you able to help?



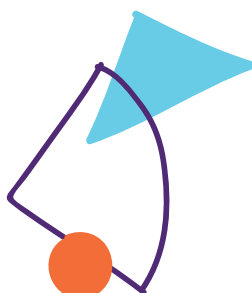
What is your challenge to complete in this island?

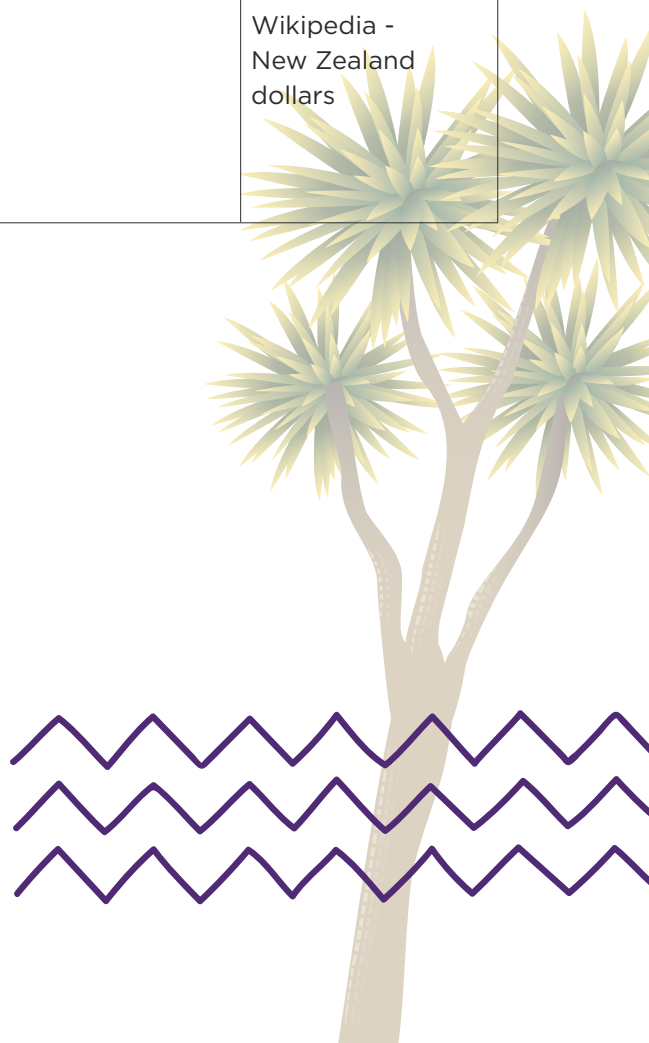

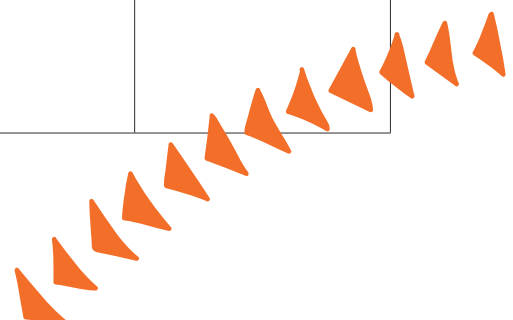
